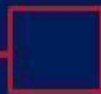


School Uniform and Personal Appearance Policy



School Uniform and Personal Appearance Policy 2024

School uniform

Wearing the official school uniform is mandatory for all Craighouse School pupils. The uniform should always be clean and must be worn correctly. Personal appearance, as indicated in this policy, should always be taken care of. This represents the value of respect, the attribute of formality and the British tradition.

Parents are asked to adhere to, comply with and enforce this policy, and to cooperate with its implementation, in terms of uniform use and their children's personal appearance. Non-compliance will be dealt with in accordance with the School Life Guide.

Description

Prekinder until Year 3 pupils

- The uniform for pupils from Prekinder to Year 3 is the official Craighouse School tracksuit.
- Under the tracksuit they must wear the official Physical Education uniform, i.e. navy blue shorts, official white T-shirt, white socks and white or black trainers with no logos.
- Anorak/Parka: pupils may wear the school's blue parka or a navy blue or black anorak.
- Pupils from Prekinder to Year 3 must bring their book bag.
- The school sun hat will be **mandatory** and must be worn daily for all outdoor activities.
- For certain specific activities, they must wear a waterproof bib.
- In winter, pupils can only wear navy blue or black scarves, gloves and hats, with no logos.
- In cases of snow or heavy rain, pupils may wear snow or rain boots, which must be blue or black.



Girls' uniform Years 4 to 12

- Navy blue blazer with collar, lapel, embroidered school badge and patch pockets.
- The blazer must be worn during assemblies and for all official ceremonies.
- Official Craighouse School grey skirt.
- Official light blue blouse with badge (short sleeves in summer and long sleeves during the rest of the year).
- Official Craighouse School tie worn with the blouse completely buttoned up. The tie must be worn with an appropriate necktie knot.
- Grey knee-length socks.
- Grey tights in winter. Girls in Year 12 must wear nylon tights for official Craighouse School ceremonies.
- Black shoes with no heels that can be polished.
- The use of grey pants is authorised for female pupils from Year 4 to Year 12 during winter months.
- Anorak/Parka: pupils may wear the school's blue parka or navy blue or black anorak.
- Pupils from Year 4 must bring their book bag.
- Only girls in Year 12 will be authorised to wear their generation fleece jacket and tie, which are different from the official one.

- In winter, girls can only wear navy blue or black scarves, gloves and hats, with no logos.
- In cases of snow or heavy rain, girls may wear snow or rain boots, which must be blue or black.

For girls in Years 4, please consider the following:

- During official ceremonies, blazer and tie are mandatory.
- The school sun hat will be **mandatory** and must be worn daily for all outdoor activities.
- Pupils may wear the official fleece under the blazer during ceremonies.

Girls in Years 5 to 12:

- For all formal activities (ceremonies, interviews, assemblies etc.) girls must wear their blazer and tie.
- Pupils may wear the fleece jacket under the official blazer when entering and leaving school and during official ceremonies.
- The school sun hat will be optional and can be worn for outdoor activities.

Boys' uniform Years 4 to 12

- Navy blue blazer with collar, lapel, embroidered school badge and buttonhole-type pockets. It must be worn during assemblies and for all official ceremonies.
- Official grey trousers with black belt.
- Official light blue shirt worn inside the trousers.
- Official Craighouse School tie worn with the shirt completely buttoned up. The tie must be worn with an appropriate necktie knot.
- Grey socks.
- Black shoes that can be polished.
- Anorak/Parka: pupils may wear navy blue or black anorak.
- Pupils from Year 4 must bring their book bag.
- Only boys in Year 12 will be authorised to wear their generation fleece jacket and tie which are different from the official school fleece jacket.
- In winter, boys can only wear navy blue or black scarves, gloves and hats, with no logos.
- In cases of snow or heavy rain, boys may wear snow or rain boots, which must be blue or black.

For boys in Years 4, please consider the following:

- When entering and leaving the school, and during official ceremonies, boys must wear their blazer, skirt and tie.
- The school sun hat will be **mandatory** and must be worn daily for all outdoor activities.
- Pupils may wear the official fleece under the official blazer during official ceremonies.

Boys in Years 5 to 12

- For all formal activities (ceremonies, interviews, assemblies etc.) boys must wear their blazer, skirt and tie.
- Pupils may wear the fleece jacket under the official blazer when entering and leaving the school and during official ceremonies.
- The school sun hat will be optional and can be worn for outdoor activities.

Personal appearance

For Craighouse School the uniform and personal appearance faithfully reflect our history, where formality, British traditions and the value of respect for norms and traditions are of the utmost importance, as they are necessary for a healthy coexistence and they are part of the development of the pupils.

At Craighouse School, our pupils' personal and educational development is a joint task between the school and the family which must be carried out in coordination, respecting agreements, contributing to their implementation, following our school policies and promoting the values expressed in the Craighouse School Educational Project since its inception.

Non-compliance will be dealt with in accordance with the School Life Guide.

Girls

→ Girls from Prekinder to Year 4 with long hair must wear it tied back with a navy blue, red or white clip, hair tie (colet) or hairband. This is a recommendation from the infirmary for the prevention of lice.

From Prekinder to Year 12

- Girls hair should be clean, combed and away from the face.
- No makeup or nail polish will be allowed.
- A pair of small earrings in the earlobes are optional (other types of jewellery will not be allowed). No piercings, expansions are allowed.
- If a vest is worn under the blouse, it must be white, without a turtle neck and the sleeves must be shorter than the sleeves of the blouse.
- Socks must be worn pulled up to knee length.
- The uniform must be clean, impeccable and neat at all times.
- Girls are not allowed to dye their hair in unnatural colours or use artificial chemical treatments to create unnatural styles.
- In case a girl has any kind of disability that impedes movement due to a medical condition which has been duly credited by a medical certificate, she will be authorised to wear the official school tracksuit to class.
- Girls in Year 12 are authorised to wear skin-coloured/clear tights or socks.

Boys

- From Prekinder to Year 12, boys' hair must be clean, combed and away from the face, above collar length.
- Faces must be clean shaven.

- If a vest is worn under the shirt, it must be white, without a turtle neck and the sleeves must be shorter than the sleeves of the shirt.
- The uniform must be clean, impeccable and neat at all times.
- Jewellery is not allowed, no piercings, expansions or earrings.
- Boys are not allowed to dye their hair in unnatural colours or use artificial chemical treatments to create unnatural styles.
- Pupils must not wear caps in school except for the branded Craighouse cap during summer.
- In case a boy has any kind of disability that impedes movement due to a medical condition which has been duly credited by a medical certificate, he will be authorised to wear the official school tracksuit to class.
